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# Use recommended writing approaches

Examples of recommended activities to support writing.

- ✓ Support a student by providing a scribe or using speech-totext so they can communicate their ideas effectively.
- ✓ Use a recording device to record ideas orally.
- ✓ Use planning tools and strategies such as brainstorms and mind maps.
- ✓ Use storyboards to organise ideas and provide a structure.
- ✓ Use images and word or blends charts to support vocabulary.
- ✓ Use a checklist to focus on sentence structure or grammar.

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
