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# Caves, watering holes, and campfires

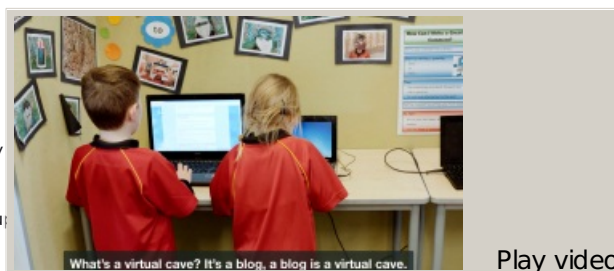
Stephen Collis describes physical and virtual spaces, which provide flexibility. Students can re-arrange them to meet their needs.
