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## Support students to enjoy and express their cultural identity

Schools should reflect and accommodate the diversity of their students in their uniform policies. This can be achieved by including items of cultural or religious significance as part of the uniform and/or allowing adaptations. Include a specific provision in the policy permitting students to wear items of cultural or religious significance with, or instead of, uniform items (e.g. ie faitaga).
